## MacDonald Training Center Hosts Free Fine Arts Retrospective June 30 in Tampa

*Public reception celebrates fine artists with disabilities*

**TAMPA, FL - June 4, 2026: MacDonald Training Center (MTC)** will host “Cocktails, Conversation and Art: A Fine Arts Retrospective & Reception” on **Tuesday, June 30, 2026, from 5:30 to 8:00 PM** at MTC’s **Joy McCann Culverhouse Fine Arts Gallery** (5420 W. Cypress St., Tampa).

The event will feature curated works by Fine Artists - adults with disabilities - and is open to media for early gallery viewings and interviews.

Featured works include “Countryside” by MTC Fine Artist **Matthew LeBrecque**, whose vibrant abstract piece anchors the event campaign. **Fifty-five percent (55%) of all art sale proceeds go directly to the individual artists**, with the remaining 45% sustaining the MTC Fine Arts Program.
